WHAT'S APP?

Biz Marketing Plan -

MarketMyBiz is an Australian Government free iPad app that provides a template to help you get started on writing your marketing plan.

Emergency Management and Recovery Plan

MyBizShield is another Australian Government free iPad app that is an interactive tool to help you protect your business from disasters and other emergencies. Search for it at the App store from your iPad.

Google+- Getting started on Google+? This iPad app is fantastic - has a great layout showing recent notifications, a 'newsfeed' with updates Lyn PB from your circles, easy access to your communities and more - it's easier to use than the PC interface! Naturally, also available for android

Business Card Scanner -

CamCard for iPhone allows you to scan up to 20 cards initially then 2 additional each week. You shoot a photo of a business card and the software automatically recognises the text and processes the information into address books fields. Available for iPhone and android there's a lite (free) version or a paid version.

"Greetings! I just read through your blog and we liked it. We were curious if you're going to develop more web content to go in conjunction with this blog?"

"Love your site! I'm going to bookmark it now."

Most often there will be a link of some sort included in the poster's details. Another feature is the poster may be using a strange name like "Bolle Sunglasses" or "Lose Weight Now". These are dead give-aways that they are not legit comments!

PODCAST

Prefer to get your info via podcasts in the car or while walking/working out? Then check out the Virtual **Business Show!**

These comments are known as CSS Hack Attacks - CSS meaning "Cross Site Scripting". The commenters are using software to post on your site automatically, without even visiting it. Why? They're hoping they may get a backlink from your site to theirs (or the site they are representing) thereby improving their search engine ranking and getting visitors to their site from yours should people click on their link. Usually the link is to some sort of sales page.

There are a couple of things you can do. First of all ensure that commenting on posts needs to be approved by you before the comments go up. Do this in the **Discussion**

section of your Settings ensuring that 'An Administrator must always approve the comment' is ticked beside the 'Before a comment appears' setting. Then, say, once a week go to your control panel of your blog or site in Wordpress and go through the comments. Legit ones you can approve. Any that look a bit sus you can either spam or trash, or if you don't mind what they say and can't bear not putting what appears to be a positive comment on your site, you can remove the link before posting it.

You can automate this process however with a couple of plug-ins:

- 1. Akismet possibly the best way to protect your blog from comment and trackback spam. From your plug-ins control panel search for Akismet to find and install it. It's free for non-commercial blogs but you will need an API Key - follow the links in the plug-in settings to get one.
- 2. Anti Spam Bee is another popular plug-in I've not used it so cannot comment but search for it from your plug-ins control panel.
- 3. This little plug-in was written by Charly Leetham one of the best Wordpress people I know! It's designed to stop people being able to post the comment unless they are actually on your site - so that'll get rid of any of those people using automated software.
