Tech Talk - Support for Windows XP Ending

If you're using Windows XP take note of this date: April 8, 2014. That's D Day - when Microsoft will end tech support for the platform. That means no more security updates for you. And we all know how important THEY are! And if you still don't care, here are some reasons given at the Windows blog for why you might consider upgrading.

Primary among them is that new hardware options will likely not support the Windows XP operating system.

I'm not overly concerned myself and for some info on what features have been removed from XP in Windows 7 see this article.

For features that have been removed in Windows Vista see this article.

The Australian Tax Office says it will be transitioning some 22000 users over to the new platform in November this year. Personally I think this might be a perfect opportunity to switch my PC for a Mac and stop being beholden to a company who insists on releasing software with known bugs and who then holds customers and users to ransom with constant updates and paid tech support. That's fine and that's their business model ... but I don't have to subscribe to it.

It has shortcomings - as in it uses standard text-to-speech tech so sounds a bit robotic. But if you can get over that, apparently it works effectively and is quick. Simply type in the URL of the blog you want converted, and Podcastomatic automatically creates audio files for each blog entry.
